After Sexual Harm: Mapping The Journeys Of Victim-Survivors' In Accessing Support

Are you a victim-survivor of sexual harm aged 18 or over?

I am conducting research to understand how victim-survivors navigate decisions about whether (or not) to tell someone about the sexual harm they have been subjected to. Your insights could help improve how both formal and informal support systems respond, making them more compassionate and effective.

Sexual harm includes anything non-consensual, such as; sexual assault, rape, image-based (e.g. revenge porn), sexual exploitation, or childhood sexual abuse.

I am interested in learning about:

- How you decided whether (or not) to tell someone about the sexual harm you were subjected to.
- If you chose to tell someone, who did you tell? Was it a friend, family member, healthcare provider, support service, the police, or someone else?
- How they responded, and how their response affected you?
- The barriers and facilitators you faced when seeking support.
