Masculinity and psychological distress among bisexual men with experience of help-seeking for intimate partner violence (IPV)/Abuse

We would like to invite bisexual men with a previous experience(s) of intimate partner violence (IPV)/abuse to take part in an online interview (approx. 1 hour) about their experiences of IPV, including questions about help-seeking, sexuality, masculinity and psychological distress. The study findings will help us to better understand bisexual men's experiences of IPV/abuse and help-seeking for IPV/abuse.

Participants will be offered a £10 voucher (Amazon or Tesco) for their time.

Ethical approval has been provided by Royal Holloway University of London Ethics Department.

To take part, you need to:

- Identify as a bisexual man
- Be at least 18 years old
- Identify as a someone with a previous experience(s) of IPV/abuse, beginning in adulthood (18+)
- Be currently receiving or have previously received support from Third-Sector Organisations (TSOs) for IPV/abuse, domestic violence and/or sexual violence
